

DISCONTINUE CONTACT LENS WEAR PRIOR TO LASIK

Accurate measurements of the thickness and curvature of the front surface of your eyes (the cornea) are essential for good LASIK results.

Because contact lenses can alter the shape and thickness of your corneas, you must discontinue contact lens wear for the following minimum periods of time prior to your LASIK pre-operative exam to allow your corneas to return to their normal dimensions:

Soft contact lenses	2 weeks prior to pre-op exam
Rigid gas permeable (RGP) contact lenses	4 weeks prior to pre-op exam
Hard (non-gas permeable) contact lenses	8 weeks prior to pre-op exam

Do not resume contact lens wear between your pre-operative exam and your LASIK surgery date unless advised to do so.

Failure to discontinue contact lens wear as directed prior to your pre-operative exam and LASIK surgery can cause unpredictable and undesired results.

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
