Warrens Cranberry Festival Awards 2011 Scholarships

WARRENS, WISCONSIN, June 9, 2011—Warrens Cranberry Festival announced the winners of its six academic scholarships for 2011. Each year six scholarships are awarded to local area students to help them achieve higher educational goals.

Trista McGovern, of *Sparta, WI*, was awarded the \$500 Warrens Cranberry Festival Inc. Scholarship and plans to attend the Art Institute International of Minnesota. To be eligible for the award, students were required to be residents of the Tomah Area School District and be accepted into a two or four-year course of study involving the arts.

Courtney Pearson, of *Warrens, WI*, was awarded the \$500 Warrens Cranberry Festival Inc. Scholarship and is pursuing a degree at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls. The scholarship requirements include being a resident of the Tomah Area School District as well as, a current or former member of the Tomah High School Marching Band. Applicants were to be accepted into a two or four-year course of study with demonstrated intent to continue musical performance.

Heather Fleming, of *Tomah, WI*, was awarded the \$500 Warrens Cranberry Festival Inc. Scholarship and plans to attend Mid-State Technical College. Residents of the Tomah Area School District who were accepted into a two or four-year program with an emphasis in Agri-Business, Ag-Science or Environmental Study were eligible to apply.

Emma Heser, of *Tomah, WI*, was awarded the \$500 Warrens Cranberry Festival Inc. Scholarship and is pursuing a degree at UW-Richland. Students in the Tomah Area School District who were accepted into an Agricultural Program were eligible to apply.

Jeannie Kortas, of *Tomah, WI*, was awarded the \$500 Warrens Cranberry Festival, Inc., Scholarship and plans to attend Winona State University. To be eligible for the award, students were required to be accepted into a two or four-year course of study with an emphasis on education.

Scott Kaul, of *Warrens, WI*, was awarded the \$500 Warrens Cranberry Festival Inc. Scholarship and is pursuing a degree at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. The scholarship requirements included being a resident of the Tomah Area School District and pursuing a career in Law Enforcement.

The purpose of the Warrens Cranberry Festival shall be to promote the common good and general welfare of the community of Warrens, including holding an annual community festival and raising funds to be used exclusively for civic betterments and social improvements in the Warrens community.
