This year, our festival benefits Chippewa Valley Habitat for Humanity. Founded in 1991, CVH4H is an ecumenical Christian ministry with the goal of eliminating poverty housing in the world. Since its inception, they have built or renovated over 30 homes. Habitat challenges individuals, churches, businesses, foundations and other organizations to tackle sub-standard housing in their community.



Habitat homes are built with community volunteer labor and donated or discounted materials made available by our invaluable community partners. CVH4H believes in building more than homes, we believe in building hope, and community. Home ownership is many families' first step towards feeling a sense of financial security and true community.

Our home owners pay for their new homes through no interest loans made available by CVH4H, and by putting in sweat equity to complete their home, as well as work on another Habitat home.

CVH4H homes end up costing around \$85,000 to build and average around 150 volunteers per home. All of our homes are a testament to the generosity of our community volunteers and partners, as well as a marked blow against homelessness and substandard housing in the Chippewa Valley.
